1.0 Introduction

Over the course of the last few decades, the South Mountain Region has seen significant growth and land development. Recognizing this growth, South Mountain Partnership has created the State of the Region Report to measure and report on how the region's resources are being affected by these growth efforts by their partners to respond to it.
